# Labour Law - Italian and Israeli Perspectives

Joint virtual course via the Zoom platform - February–May 2023 (2 nd Semester)  
Department of Law, Unimore – Law School, Sapir Academic College

(Prof. Alberto TAMPIERI – Dr. Edo ESHET)

Number of academic credits - CFU (Unimore students): 2 cfu LMG; 3 cfu SGIPA (\*)

All developed countries use Labour Law to regulate their social goals. Through the lens of comparative law, we will look at labour-related matters in Italy and Israel. Among other topics, we will examine:

- “Who is an employee? The case for the “platform workers” and the “algorithmic management”.
- “Is there a constitutional legal right to conduct a collective bargaining? Is there a legal requirement for good faith bargaining? Who (employer or employee) is bound by a collective agreement?”
- “What is the legal framework for safeguarding the right to strike, particularly in the essential public services?”

After a prior introduction of the course (first meeting), in the following meetings each of us will deliver a short (30-45 minutes) presentation about the course’s comparative topics. Then, we will divide our students to small and mixed groups in a dedicated, separated, zoom meeting in which Italian and Israeli students will feel free to exchange their views and knowledge with each other participants.

The course will be taught in English. Pre-requisites for attending the course are a good knowledge of the English language and (for Unimore students) a basic knowledge of the Italian Labour Law principles.
